What are National Occupational Standards (NOS)?

A suite of NOS describes the knowledge and skills required to carry out a specific job role.

NOS are vitally important as they act as the national benchmark against which employers can measure the competencies of their workforce and determine where they have skills shortages. There are 115 uses for NOS which benefit individuals and employers, most commonly they are used to influence the design of training programmes, qualifications, job specifications and appraisals.

In order that the NOS accurately reflect the full range of skills and knowledge that is required within each security sub sector, we need industry representation from across the UK to join the Advisory Working Groups.
